SCOTLAND'S ORAL HEALTH PLAN – A SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT CONSULTATION EXERCISE ON THE FUTURE OF ORAL HEALTH.

Summary

- 1. This Memorandum advises dentists and dental bodies corporate (DBCs) of the launch of *Scotland's Oral Health Plan A Scottish Government Consultation Exercise On the Future of Oral Health*.
- 2. Since the publication of the last Dental Action Plan in 2005, the landscape in NHS dentistry has changed considerably, with significant improvements in oral health amongst children, better access for patients to a NHS dentistry, and a substantial increase in the numbers of dentists, and dental staff, routinely providing NHS dental care.
- 3. The purpose of this consultation exercise is to build on this success story. We face a complex set of challenges around oral health inequalities, an ageing population, and how we shift the emphasis from restorative dentistry to a more preventive-focused approach.

Consultation Document

- 4. The publication of this consultation document represents the start of our stakeholder engagement. We will be talking and listening to patients, the dental team, and other health care professionals, as well as the wider NHS, in how we take dental services forward to meet the challenges facing us in the future.

We want as many people as possible to participate in this consultation exercise. A questionnaire is available (at the same link) for people to provide their views on the issues that will help shape the future of NHS dentistry in Scotland.

6. The consultation will run for a period of three months, from 15th September to 8th December 2016 inclusive.

Roadshow Events

- 7. Central to the consultation is ensuring that dental professionals are informed about the drivers for change and the strategic priorities. Therefore, the consultation exercise will include a sequence of roadshow events with dentists, dental staff, and other NHS staff. Each event will follow a similar format, with a main presentation, and a series of breakout groups on particular themes relevant to the consultation exercise. These events will allow attendees the opportunity to discuss some of the key issues arising from the consultation document with the Chief Dental Officer and other Scottish Government officials, in a structured and informative way.

11. The Scottish Government will publish the analysis of the consultation responses in the Spring of 2017. A Dental Action Plan will be published in 2017/18.
